The Instructors:

William Hopson

William is regarded by many as one of the finest alphorn soloists of his generation. He has performed at many alphorn competitions in Switzerland and has received First Class Honors by jurors. He has been a French horn player for the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra since 1977.

Combining his talents as a musician and a craftsman, he founded Rocky Mountain Alphorns several years ago to hand build a superior line of alphorns. William has a BA in Music from Oberlin College.



Fritz Frautschi

A native of Switzerland, Fritz currently teaches at the Saanenland Obersimmental School of Music and leads alphorn courses and performances at the Swiss Alphorn School. He also serves as a member of the Alphorn jury for the Swiss Yodeler Federation (which oversees all Alphorn competitions in Switzerland). Fritz also teaches privately and directs the operations of Fritz Frautschi Alphorn – Atelier, which deals in products related to the alphorn.



Brian Priebe

Brian is a gifted music director, singer and world-class instrumentalist on both the trombone and alphorn. He is a former member of the Utah Chamber Orchestra and has also played his trombone in appearances with many celebrities and in many studio sessions with other professional musicians. In 2007, he placed 2nd out of 120 competitors in the International Alphorn Festival in Nendaz, Switzerland. Brian has a BS in Music Education and an MM in Trombone Performance.



Tony Brazelton

Tony is the founder of this North American Alphorn Retreat and also the founder of the popular musical group Salzburger Echo, based in Salt Lake City. Salzburger Echo performs at some of the largest Oktoberfest celebrations in the US, as well as at hundreds of elementary schools around the country, corporate retreats and other events. Tony placed 3rd in the 2008 International Alphorn competition in Nendaz, Switzerland. He has a BS in Music Education and an MM in Trumpet Performance.
